This certificate is intended to benefit Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, and bachelor's degree transfer students. It consists of courses that satisfy the first 31 hours of the relevant degree requirements. These courses address the general education outcomes, fulfill a majority of the Ohio Transfer 36 requirements, and align with most of the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathways associated with the AA and AS degrees.

Courses in the certificate tend to reinforce each other and work well together to develop the student's abilities. This certificate lays out a pathway to success by directing students towards completing important milestones including:

- Completing the English Composition Sequence
- Completing the Math Requirement
- Beginning a Major
- Completing 30 Hours

Students completing this certificate will be prepared to succeed in their AA, AS, and Bachelor's degrees.
